Phase 1-Standby Emergency Generators (the "Project")

The Passaic Valley Water Commission intends to file an application with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust for the purpose of constructing the Project.

The Project consists of constructing four 3,000 KW diesel generators (12,000 KW total) with generator building, switchgear, fuel storage, and related facilities to add 81 MGD of backup power capacity, including 25 MGD of Wanaque pumping and 56 MGD of Little Falls Water Treatment Plant treatment and pumping.

This is a portion of Phase 1 of an overall project to replace the three uncovered treated water reservoirs with covered water storage tanks and make additional pumping and backup power improvements needed to maintain the reliability of the system.

The design of the Phase 1 Standby Emergency Generator Project is anticipated to be completed in July of 2014. Construction will take place over the 2-year period following award of the construction contract. The construction cost is anticipated to be approximately \$17,650,000 million, and is included on PVWC's 5-year capital plan.

WHEREAS, under Contract No. 12-B-17 "Furnish and Deliver Water Meters and Appurtenances and Scheduling Services" (the "Contract"), Neptune Technology Group, Inc. of Tallassee, Alabama (also referred to herein as the "Contractor") provided, and continues to provide, goods and services under this 2-year contract with the Passaic Valley Water Commission ("PVWC") consistently and reliably and effectively and efficiently on an as-needed basis with the Contract commencing March 21, 2012; and

WHEREAS, under the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. as amended April 17, 2000 (the "Act"), certain discretionary provisions enabled under said Act, including extensions to existing contracts under N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15, were subsequently adopted by PVWC; and

whereas, under N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15, extensions to existing contracts provide for up to two (2) additional years for contracts which are two (2) years or less, (for a total contract duration not to exceed four (4) years), with recommended actions concerning any and all such extensions subject to PVWC approval through Resolutions; and

whereas, the currently active Contract, otherwise scheduled to end on or about March 20, 2014, includes a provision whereby PVWC may elect to allow said Contract to expire at the end of the time stipulated, or to extend the contract time by annual or semi-annual

periods, for a total contract duration not to exceed the maximum allowable set forth hereinabove; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Contract, the Contractor is required to maintain and extend all insurance and performance bonds, and any other bonds, and to continue to provide goods and services under the extended contract under the terms and conditions of the existing contract; and

WHEREAS, it is, therefore, in the best interests of PVWC, its users and constituent municipalities to extend the Contract for a 1-year period of time beginning March 21, 2014 and ending on March 20, 2015; all as indicated in the Director of Engineering's memorandum dated March 11, 2014, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the Director of Purchasing's memorandum dated March 11, 2014, along with the Contractor's correspondence dated March 11, 2014 agreeing to a 1-year extension of the Contract (under the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents) and other relevant correspondence, is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B; and

whereas, the unit quantities stipulated under the original 2-year Contract are hereby adjusted and reestablished for this 1-year extended portion of the Contract, and, based on the appropriate adjustment of the unit prices currently in effect under the Contract (in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15 and as set forth in the contract documents) and the resulting negotiated increase of zero (0) percent to said unit prices, the total amount of this extended portion of the Contract equates to \$1,221,284.73; and

WHEREAS, PVWC's Comptroller has certified, with respect hereto, that funds are currently available for said purpose, and said certificate is included herewith and made a part hereof as Exhibit C;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by Passaic Valley Water Commission, in the County of Passaic, New Jersey:

- 1. That PVWC hereby authorizes and awards a 1-year extension to Contract No. 12-B-17 "Furnish and Deliver Water Meters and Appurtenances and Scheduling Services" to Neptune Technology Group, Inc. of Tallassee, Alabama commencing March 21, 2014 and expiring on March 20, 2015; all in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15; and in an amount not to exceed \$1,221,284.73.
- 2. That the terms of this 1-year extension to the Contract are embodied in this Resolution and Exhibit A which is incorporated herein as the amendment to the Contract.
- 3. That appropriate officers of the Commission are hereby authorized and directed to execute this Contract extension as set forth hereinabove and implement the terms of this extended Contract in accordance with this Resolution and the submissions provided in connection herewith, and the Secretary of PVWC to attest to this Contract extension and such other officers, employees and officials of PVWC are hereby authorized to perform such acts and execute such documents as are necessary to implement the terms and intentions of this Resolution.

Under Contract No. 12-B-17 "Furnish and Deliver Water Meters and Appurtenances and Scheduling Services", Neptune Technology Group, Inc. of Tallassee, Alabama (the "Contractor") has, and continues to, provide goods and services consistently and reliably and effectively and efficiently on an asneeded basis with the said contract commencing on or about March 21, 2012. This 2-year contract, which is otherwise scheduled to end on or about March 20, 2014, includes a provision whereby PVWC may elect to allow the said contract to expire at the end of the time stipulated, or to extend the contract time by annual or multi-annual periods, for a total contract duration of not more than four (4) years, including extensions. A 1-year extension would result in an overall contract duration of three (3) years which would be permissible under the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15 because it would not exceed the maximum allowable.

Attached is a copy of the Director of Purchasing's memorandum dated March 11, 2014 along with the Contractor's correspondence dated March 11, 2014 agreeing to a 1-year extension of the contract under the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

It is recommended that, subject to review and approval by the Law Department, Contract 12-B-17 be extended for a 1-year period of time beginning March 21, 2014 and ending on March 20, 2015. Based on the reestablishment of the unit quantities for the 1-year extension, and adjustments of the unit prices [by an negotiated and agreed-to escalation Index⁽¹⁾ adjustment of zero (0) percent], all in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-15, the total amount of the extended portion of the contract equates to \$1,221,284.73.

Note: (1) In accordance with <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40A:11-15, the Index Rate is the rate of annual percent increase, rounded to the nearest half-percent, in the Implicit Price Deflator for State and Local Government Purchases of Goods and Services, computed and published quarterly by the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis.
