RESOLUTION OF PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION
AUTHORIZING A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH BRICK
TOWNSHIP MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY FOR ANALYTICAL
LABORATORY SERVICES

DATE OF ADOPTION: FEBRUARY 19, 2020

Approved as to form and legality by the Law Department on the basis of facts and circumstances set forth by the Executive Director, Director of Engineering, Laboratory Manager, and the Purchasing and Finance Departments.

Introduced by Commissioner: <u>VANNOY</u>

Seconded by Commissioner: **COTTON**

WHEREAS, the Passaic Valley Water Commission (the "PVWC") has authorized procurement of analytical laboratory services for Metals, Inorganics, Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC's), Haloacetic Acids (HAA's), MIB and Geosmin, and Chlorates, ("Laboratory Services") through a shared services agreement with the Brick Township Municipal Utilities Authority (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, a copy of a memorandum from PVWC's Laboratory Manager) dated January 24, 2020 with attached correspondence from the Authority dated January 2, 2020, along with other relevant correspondence, are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Laboratory Services shall be provided by the Authority in accordance with the form of shared services agreement including Technical Specification Sections 02100, 02101 02102 and 02103 (including agreed to modifications requested by the Authority, reviewed and agreed to by PVWC, and subsequently incorporated therein) attached hereto as Appendix A (collectively the "Shared Services Agreement"), and a copy of the Shared Services Agreement is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Shared Services Agreement has been reviewed by the Executive Director, Director of Engineering, Laboratory Manager, and Director of Purchasing; (and General Counsel, as to form and legality), and is recommended for acceptance; and

by which quality analytical data are generated and shall be in compliance with the QAP previously submitted by the Authority with the Bid.

- E. The Authority shall provide sample analysis results to the Commission via electronic mail within 48 hours of sample receipt by the Authority's laboratory, Mondays through Fridays inclusive, excluding Federal Holidays. From time to time, and on a case-by-case basis, at the sole discretion of the Commission, Authority may be permitted to extend this required turn-around time for samples to a total of no more than 5 days. However, the Authority shall not extend said turn-around time without prior written approval from the Commission for each and every such request.
- F. Authority shall follow-up each electronic transmission with a hard copy certified, signed and dated by the Authority and mailed US Postal Service First Class in an opaque sealed envelope addressed to the attention of Andrea Giallorenzo, Senior Chemist, Passaic Valley Water Commission, 800 Union Boulevard, Totowa, New Jersey 07512.
- G. The Authority shall analyze up to a total of 12 samples per shipment within the 48-hour turn-around basis as described above.
- H. Deliverables for Reports shall be as follows:
 - 1. Final Reports shall be submitted by the Authority to PVWC and shall contain as a minimum each of the following elements:
 - a) Report Title
 - b) Purchase Order Number
 - c) Lab Contact Information
 - d) Report Number
 - e) Commission Contact Information
 - f) Sample Identification
 - g) Sample Collection Date/Time
 - h) Sample Preparation Date/Time and Analyst Identification
 - i) Sample Analysis Date/Time and Analyst Identification
 - j) Test Method and Notation identifying any method deviations
 - k) Test Result
 - 1) Test Reporting Units
 - m) Minimum Reporting Limits for each analyte
 - n) Signature and Title of the person(s) authorized to release final results
 - o) Notation of results whose values are reported outside of quantification limits
 - 2. Hard copy sample reports shall include Quality Control information such as MDLs, matrix spike, matrix blank and matrix duplicates, and all other Quality Control data collected as required by Standard Method 6040D plus associated chapters. Results below the MDL shall also be reported and noted as being below the MDL.
 - 3. The Authority shall submit multi-point MDL studies data of content and form acceptable to the Commission on an annual basis for the duration of the Contract, including any and all approved extensions thereto.
 - 4. The Commission reserves the right to require Authority to provide the Commission with copies of actual chromatograms, for potential future identification of any other major peaks that may be considered as contributory to taste-and-odor in the source of finished waters.

1.04 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

A. Anticipated quantities of analyses are as stipulated in the Agreement and outlined in the sample matrix table included in Table 1 entitled "MIB/Geosmin Sample Matrix – 24-Month Testing Schedule" as specified herein, and a copy of Table 1 is attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Commission reserves the right to adjust the number and frequency of samples on an as-required basis. The Authority shall provide all goods and services as specified or required by the Contract Documents, or which can be reasonably inferred therefrom, for the duration of the Contract, including any and all approved extensions thereto.

- B. The Unit Price set forth in the Agreement shall be considered as having included sampling kits with formal chain of custody forms, labeling, sample bottles, packing materials and ice packs; furnishing and shipping empty containers to the Commission and shipping samples to the Authority for testing; handling, analyses including 48-hour analysis turn-around as specified elsewhere herein, and disposal of all waste from sampling, preservation and analysis; and providing all other goods and services necessary to complete the Work of this Contract. All shipping shall be included in said Unit Price and shall include postage (US Postal Service First Class, or approved equal), pickup and delivery service with all deliveries and pickups to be directly to and from the designated location in or at the Commission's Laboratory in the Control Building at the Commission's Little Falls Water Treatment Plant.
- C. The Unit Price shall be considered as complete and including all Work required under this Contract. Each analysis shall consist of one combined MIB and Geosmin analysis, and the quantities stipulated in the Agreement are based on the anticipated total number of combined analyses. For example, one combined analysis for both MIB and Geosmin is counted as one analysis. In the event that sample re-testing and re-analysis is required due to error by the Authority, its laboratory, or its shipping service provider, or any combination thereof, Authority shall perform any and all required re-testing and reanalysis and shall bear any and all related costs for same.

Notes: 1. Actual starting month for Table 1 will be based on the actual commencement date of the Contract and may shift based on said Contract commencement date. In such case, total samples per each subsequent month beyond the last month listed in Table 1 will be the same as the total samples per month stipulated for the corresponding month of the prior year. This will also apply for any and all approved extensions to the Contract.

2. Sampling locations designated in Table 1 under the heading "Raw Unfinished Water" for Commission designation 101, 612, and 100 refer to Little Falls Water Treatment Plant Head-gate; Pompton River at Wanaque South Pump Station; and at Little Falls Water Treatment Plant intake, respectively.

SECTION 02103 ANALYTICAL LABORATORY SERVICES FOR ANAYSIS OF WATER SAMPLES FOR CHLORATE

1.01 GENERAL

- A. The Authority shall perform laboratory determination of Chlorate in water samples for PVWC.
- B. The Authority shall furnish laboratory analysis of all water samples (typically finished or partially treated drinking water) for chlorate content, in accordance with EPA Method 300.0, Method 300.1 or equivalent method recognized by the NJDEP.
- C. The Authority's laboratory shall be, and maintain, its New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) certified laboratory status and certified by NJDEP to perform testing in water for Chlorate. Alternative certification by the USEPA to perform water testing under the UCMR-3 program is also satisfactory.
- D. Authority's pricing shall remain in effect for the duration of the Contract. The number of samples is estimated to be up to twenty (20) per year during the term of this Contract. Reimbursement to the Authority will be on a "take and pay" basis where PVWC reserves the right to order all, same, or none of the stipulated quantities set forth herein.
- E. - F. The period of this Contract shall be as set forth in the Agreement.

1.02 SHIPMENTS, PICKUPS AND DELIVERIES

- A. The Authority shall provide sample collection containers, associated sampling materials and instructions, and shipping materials for PVWC to use for this Work.
- B. PVWC will deliver samples to the Authority's laboratory at Authority's expense, using Authority's specified means of shipping. Authority may pick up the samples at PVWC's facility at PVWC's Little Falls Water Treatment plant, Totowa, NJ at the Authority's discretion. In any case all holding times and temperatures specified in the quoted method must be maintained. In the event that shipped samples are received above acceptable temperature levels due to improper sample shipping preparation, the Commission will pay the costs for shipping of such samples.
- C. The Vendor shall be responsible for disposal of sample container, preserved sample and any associated waste products generated during analysis, and all other contents of sample container.

1.03 TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

- A. Deliverables for Reports shall be delivered to the Commission as follows:

- It is highly recommended PVWC consider beginning the Fair and Open Professional Service bidding process in September. Select the subsequent years appointee in October, to allow that Broker to underwrite all renewals, own their work, present recommendations to the Board in December, prior to renewal date, and earn their commissions.

Delays on this Project are attributable to a variety of factors, not the least of which is the Contractor's failure early on to be diligent, especially in the first 14 months. Other factors which helped to slow down progress include: (i) unforeseen subsurface conditions discovered at different times during the construction, (ii) a multitude of submittals by the Contractor for "alternative equipment" and very extensive back-and-forth with the Engineer, (iii) time lost on coordination and approvals needed from PSE&G on complex, high-voltage equipment and switchgear submittals, (iv) discovery and proper disposal of contaminated soil, (v) the technical complexity of the Project, and (vi) more oversight and regulation than is normally found in projects of this nature. With respect to government oversight, the Project is funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development through a program called "CDBG-DR", which is administered by the NJEDA. Additionally, this Project is overseen by the NJDEP. All participants in this Project, including the Contractor, Engineer, the PVWC, and the State agencies, are mindful of the actual duration of this Project versus the riginal schedule. Based on costs, the contract is 64% complete. Based on PVWC's projections, it appears that Stone Hill Contracting will complete the contract on or about February 26, 2021.

Work completed:

Site work has been performed, soil nails and the MSE wall has been completed. The generator building and roof were constructed and the generators have been set in place. Fuel facilities and the associated containment area was constructed. Some site piping has been completed and the underground ductbank is complete. The switchgear has been delivered and set. 

Summary

The purpose of this Change Order is to amend the Contract Price to reflect the \$378,856.00 worth of additional work that was negotiated and agreed-upon.

It is recommended that PVWC approve proposed Change Order No. 1 to the Contract adding \$378,856.00 to the Contract Price (which equates to an increase in the Contract of approximately 5.7%) which would bring the total adjusted Contract Price to \$7,043,257.00.

This Change Order relates to adjustments to the scope of work as described in more detail in the attached breakdown of these additional work items and the costs related thereto.

Background


The Project was awarded to Phelps Construction Group, LLC ("Phelps") of Boonton, New Jersey at PVWC's Commission Meeting dated May 15, 2019 (PVWC Resolution No. 19-32) for a total bid price of \$6,664,401.00.

Change Order No. 1 modifies the scope of Contract Work to include the additional work required to address the existing unforeseen subsurface condition of excessive brittleness of the existing concrete panel substrate of the Main Pump Station roof system. This additional work includes placement of wood sheathing and fastening of same to the substrate using mechanical fasteners and specialized epoxy adhesive to properly secure the wood sheathing to the concrete panel substrate and to enable the new slate roof to be fastened to the said sheathing without damaging the concrete panel substrate.

Change Order No. 1 increases the total Contract Price by \$378,856.00 which brings the total adjusted Contract Price to \$7,043,257.00.

Change order No. 1 has been reviewed by Billow Garrett Group Architects and Planners P.C. ("Billow Garrett") of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey, PVWC's consultant for this project, and a copy of Billow Garrett's letter dated January 24, 2020 recommending approval of Change Order No. 1 is attached hereto. PVWC has reviewed Billow Garrett's recommendations and concurs with same.

Subject to review and approval by PVWC's Law Department, it is recommended that the Commission approve proposed Change Order No. 1 to the Contract as set forth hereinabove.

Dear Ms. Alesandrelli:

We are writing to summarize the conditions which promulgated the additional work associated with the existing conditions discovered at the roof substrate at the Main Pump Station and recommend approval of the requested change order. Phelps Construction conducted installation tests of the slate roof tiles on a sample of the existing concrete panel substrate. The tests revealed the existing precast concrete substrate was unable to accept the requisite slate shingle fasteners for the proposed replacement slate shingle roof in accordance with the recommended installation practices published by NRCA. The installation of the required fasteners (1-1/4" deep) caused spalling of the panels and shallow fasteners would not provide adequate fastening. This was an unknown condition.

Upon discovery the team collaborated on a number of alternate strategies to address the issue. The most effective solution is a new layer of 3/4" plywood sheathing over the existing concrete panel substrate fastening it directly to the existing roof substrate and fastening the new slate to the sheathing. The team investigated alternate solutions including use of synthetic slate and asphalt shingles (both were considered during the design process), but after analyzing the life cycle replacement costs, we determined the slate option is the most cost effective over time. This information is summarized in our letters dated, November 19, 2019, with attachments and is provided with this letter.

The method of attachment for the new sheathing will include mechanical fasteners and adhesive. Again collaborating with the team, we determined the fastening should include fastening the new plywood to the existing concrete substrate with ½" diameter Hilti KWIK HUS-EZ with 2-1/4" embedment on a grid of 24" o.c. along with Sikaflex-11-FC at 4" o.c. Since the condition is not a common condition, we will require an in situ pullout test will be performed on a minimum 2' x 4' area (up to a full sheet of plywood) with a minimum pulling force of 180 pounds or until failure. This will allow us to verify the viability of the approach prior to full installation. In addition, we will also have the contractor perform the test with the same approach indicated above except with the adhesive at 12" o.c. If this passes the test, it will significantly reduce the costs described below.

We recommend proceeding with the new slate shingle roof system, as originally specified in the contract documents, along with the new layer of plywood sheathing fastened to the existing concrete panel substrate as documented above (mechanical fasteners and adhesive at 4" o.c.), to address the unknown existing condition. The cost for this additional work is \$378,856.00. The backup is attached to this letter. The final price was negotiated with Phelps Construction and reduced the overall costs from what was originally presented.

WHEREAS, the AGREEMENT shall be for the period of time as set forth in Appendix D where applicable, or where not otherwise set forth in Appendix D, the Agreement shall be for up to a one year period of time commencing on the Effective Date of this AGREEMENT as defined in Paragraph 19 herein, and for any extended periods authorized by PVWC.

WHEREAS, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL are desirous of entering into a consulting agreement to cover the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL agree that the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT are the following: $\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}$

- 1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL'S obligations under this AGREEMENT are solely for the benefit of PVWC and no other party is intended to benefit or have rights hereunder.
- PROFESSIONAL shall perform the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES as defined under this AGREEMENT at a level customary for competent and prudent professional service providers, all as applicable, performing such services at the time and place where the services are provided ("STANDARD OF CARE"). These services will be provided by professional service providers in the appropriate disciplines, and by other professionals and individuals skilled in other technical disciplines, as PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and the coordination of all aspects of its services including reports and other deliverables and services provided under this AGREEMENT. The services to be performed by PROFESSIONAL shall conform to the generally accepted codes and regulations applicable to the subject PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL agrees to indemnify and hold PVWC harmless from all losses and damages resulting from PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE. Further, PROFESSIONAL shall correct and re-perform any services not conforming to the required STANDARD OF CARE without additional compensation and cost to PVWC, (including, but not limited to pending written or oral testimony, reports, etc., which might occur from activities resulting from the performance of this AGREEMENT which were caused by PROFESSIONAL'S performance). In addition, PROFESSIONAL shall indemnify and hold harmless PVWC and its officers, agents and employees of PVWC from and against any losses, claims, damages, or liabilities to which PVWC

may become subject insofar as and to the extent they arise out of the deviation from the STANDARD OF CARE in the performance of the services by the PROFESSIONAL, hereunder.

- The cost of services for the PROJECT shall be invoiced by the PROFESSIONAL on a Time-and-Materials basis, not to exceed \$43,000.00. PROFESSIONAL shall invoice PVWC its services hereunder after completion thereof and on the basis of reports and accompanying documents, if appropriate, on a monthly basis, including therein information as to progress in performance as against one hundred percent (100%) completion thereof and also showing amounts previously compensated hereunder, as against the total authorization. When the billing amount for actual work performed and costs incurred during the period covered by the invoice is less than \$1,000 the PROFESSIONAL shall add the service and costs to the next billing cycle. To the extent items appearing on invoices presented by PROFESSIONAL are not contested, PVWC will remit payment of the invoice as soon as it can reasonably process same in the normal course of business and barring any failure of systems related thereto or unusual staffing shortages. If at any time it appears to PROFESSIONAL that the proposed scope of services to be performed on the different aspects of any PROJECT will exceed that which was authorized by PVWC, PROFESSIONAL shall clearly indicate same in its continuing written reports. The PROJECT shall be invoiced separately. Each invoice shall include a breakdown of hours expended along with the names of individual expending said hours, along with a breakdown of charges from subcontractors where applicable and out-of-pocket expenses chargeable to the PROJECT. Each invoice shall include a summary sheet including total amount billed for the time period covered by the invoice and the time period covered, total amount billed to date, total not-to-exceed dollar amount for cost of services (said amounts as set forth or defined in Paragraph 3 herein), and balance remaining.
- 4. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible to PVWC for any subcontractors and outside associates or professional it engages to assist it in the performance of the services required under this AGREEMENT.
- 5. PVWC will provide to PROFESSIONAL all available information, including previous reports and any other data in its possession relevant to the subject PROJECT. Further, PVWC will be responsible for providing PROFESSIONAL access to all public and private property in connection with services to be performed for the PROJECT.
- 6. Both PVWC and PROFESSIONAL understand that the goal of this AGREEMENT is to complete all phases of the subject PROJECT in a reasonably expeditious fashion. To this end each pledges to the other full cooperation.
- 7. The services to be performed under this AGREEMENT for the PROJECT shall be deemed to be completed when the scope of work authorized by PVWC for the PROJECT has satisfactorily been fulfilled.
- 8. By notice in writing at any time, PVWC may change the general scope of services required by PROFESSIONAL as set forth herein. In such event an equitable adjustment, if appropriate, in compensation shall be agreed to in writing prior to PROFESSIONAL'S performing the changed services.
- 9. PROFESSIONAL shall hold secret and confidential all information designated by PVWC as confidential. PROFESSIONAL shall not reveal any designated confidential information to a third party unless the disclosing party was lawfully possessed with the information before receipt of same from the party claiming confidentiality and whose information has been designated as described herein as being confidential, or applicable law, regulation, court order or any agency of competent jurisdiction requires its disclosure; or the failure to disclose the information would pose an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment.
- 10. PROFESSIONAL shall maintain insurance against the following risk during the term of this AGREEMENT:
- a) Worker's Compensation in statutory amounts and Employer's Liability for PROFESSIONAL'S employees' for the PROJECT for related injuries or disease; and
- b) General Liability and Automobile Liability (each including excess coverage as required) and each in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for personal injury or property damage to third parties which arises from PROFESSIONAL'S performance under this AGREEMENT; and

c) Professional Liability in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for legal obligations arising out of PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE or other items covered under such Professional Liability policy.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide to the PVWC certificates of insurance as to each of the above which evidence that the policies are in effect.

- 11. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any litigation/arbitration relating to the AGREEMENT shall be venued in New Jersey. In the event of litigation, the parties agree and consent to the action being initiated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County.
- 12. PROFESSIONAL represents that it is an independent professional and not an employee of PVWC.
- 13. If a dispute or complaint arises concerning this AGREEMENT, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL will negotiate a resolution of the dispute. Should negotiations be unsuccessful, the resolution of the dispute shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the current Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitration proceeding shall be venued in New Jersey. Any decision rendered by the arbitrators shall be final. Judgment may be entered upon the decision in any court having jurisdiction. The decision shall not be subject to modification or appeal except to the extent permitted by Sections 10 and 11 of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. 10, 11). Notwithstanding the aforementioned, disputes which have a total value (exclusive of interest) in excess of the dollar amount for cost of services (said dollar amount as stipulated in paragraph 3 herein) shall not be arbitrated but shall be litigated.
- 14. All notices required or intended under this AGREEMENT may be delivered in person, by facsimile or express mail. All notices shall be effective upon the date of receipt by the parties. Notices shall be delivered or sent to the other party at the address appearing in this AGREEMENT. An address may only be changed by written notice to the other party.
- 15. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.
- c) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- d) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

- e) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to afford equal employment opportunities to minority and women workers consistent with good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or Good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.
- f) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- h) In conforming with the applicable employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- i) The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:
 - -Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
 - -Certificate of Employee Information Report
 - -Employee Information Report Form AA302
- j) The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 16. This AGREEMENT is subject to termination at the conclusion of all of the Contract work, time being of the essence as described herein, unless extended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. PVWC retains the right to terminate the PROFESSIONAL upon 15 days' notice to the PROFESSIONAL, which notice shall be effective when given to the PROFESSIONAL in writing at the PROFESSIONAL'S place of business by way of certified mail return receipt requested and regular mail. No other Notice shall be necessary. Should termination under this Article take place, the PROFESSIONAL shall be entitled to compensation for all authorized Contract work completed satisfactorily to the date of termination. PVWC shall be the sole judge of satisfactory work.
- 17. This AGREEMENT, including any schedules, attachments and referenced documents, is the entire agreement between PVWC and PROFESSIONAL. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations or representations not expressly stated herein are of no force and effect. Any changes to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PVWC and PROFESSIONAL.
- 18. A waiver or breach of any term, condition or covenant by a party shall not constitute a waiver or breach of any other term, condition or covenant. If any court of competent jurisdiction declares a provision of the AGREEMENT invalid, illegal or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.
- 19. The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be as of the date set forth hereinabove, or where such date is not indicated, the effective date of the AGREEMENT shall be when the last of the two parties is in full possession of a fully executed AGREEMENT document.

- 20. PROFESSIONAL'S hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses shall be as set forth in the PROPOSAL.
- 21. PROFESSIONAL understands and agrees that upon submission to PVWC and upon receipt of proper payment as provided for in this AGREEMENT, any reports, data, logs or other information provided to PVWC pursuant to the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT (and which are not designated in accordance with Paragraph 9 of this AGREEMENT as being confidential) are deemed to be non-proprietary to the extent that PVWC, in its sole discretion, may utilize the information submitted for whatever purposes it deems necessary or desirable without seeking permission from PROFESSIONAL, and without providing any additional compensation to PROFESSIONAL; provided, however, that PVWC shall have sole responsibility for use of such work products in applications for which they may not originally have been intended. Reports, data, logs and other information provided to PVWC by PROFESSIONAL shall become the property of PVWC provided, however, that PROFESSIONAL shall have unrestricted right to their use.
- 22. PVWC designates the Executive Director, the Chief Financial Officer, or the Director of Engineering of the PVWC as its designated representative having authority to give instructions, receive information, define PVWC'S policies, and make decisions with respect to the scope of the work to be performed. PVWC reserves the right to change these designees from time to time and will notify PROFESSIONAL of any change(s) in writing.
- 23. Except as otherwise approved by PVWC, for the PROJECT, PVWC will be responsible for furnishing all approvals and permits from governmental authorities and other entities having jurisdiction over the scope of the work to be performed and approvals from others as may be necessary for the timely completion of the said work, including payment of all permit fees.
- 24. This AGREEMENT may be executed in several counterparts and all so executed documents shall constitute one agreement, binding on all the parties hereto, notwithstanding that all the parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.

Summary

It is recommended that the Commission approve award of the above-referenced Project to JGSC Group, LLC ("JGSC Group") of Merchantville, New Jersey with reimbursement to be on a Take-and-Pay, Time-and-Materials basis, not to exceed \$139,912.00.

This reduced amount is based on a negotiated reduction in the not-to-exceed hours stipulated by PVWC in the Request for Proposals ("RFP") for the scope of work set forth therein, and without compromising PVWC's goals and objectives established for the Project for the said scope of work and related tasks set forth in the RFP.

Continuation of these services is needed for PVWC to remain in compliance with the Second Amended Administrative Consent Order (SAACO) which, among other things, requires PVWC to provide public outreach and public participation services for the Water Storage Improvement Projects.

Background

PVWC solicited for professional services (or extraordinary unspecifiable Services) for Project No. 20-P-60 entitled "Professional Services for Public Outreach and Participation for the Water Storage Improvement Projects" (hereinafter the "Project"), with said solicitation and procurement of responses (and evaluation of same) undertaken through a fair and open process, as defined in N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7 (hereinafter the "Fair and Open Process Law").

The Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i) and the Fair and Open Process Law require that notice, with respect to contracts for professional services (or extraordinary unspecifiable services), procured through a fair and open process and awarded without competitive bids, must be publicly advertised.

In subsequent discussions and negotiations with JGSC, it was agreed that the not-to-exceed hours stipulated by PVWC in the Request for Proposals ("RFP") for the scope of work set forth therein could be reduced without compromising PVWC's goals and objectives established for the Project for the scope of work and related tasks set forth in the RFP, and a copy of JGSC's Proposal (along with JGSC's subsequent correspondence dated February 11, 2020 agreeing to the said modifications) and collectively referred to herein as the "Modified Proposal", is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

JGSC (the "Awardee") was determined to be professionally qualified and capable of performing the required services with respect to the Project and the Modified Proposal. Reimbursement shall be on a Take-and-Pay, Time-and-Materials basis, not to exceed the reduced amount of \$139,912.00.

The Awardee has, and continues to, provide professional services related to the Project consistently and reliably and effectively and efficiently on an as-needed, as-requested basis.

The Modified Proposal will be incorporated into the Contract, a form of which is attached hereto as $\operatorname{Exhibit} \mathsf{C}.$

Subject to review and approval by the Law Department, it is recommended that the Project 20-P-60 be awarded JGSC Group, LLC ("JGSC Group") in the not-to-exceed, reduced total amount of \$139,912.00.





Background

JGSC Group was retained, in July of 2015, by the Passaic Valley Water Commissioner (PVWC) to provide public outreach and engagement services for the Water Storage Improvement project. In response to the USEPA LT2 Rule, as well as an Administrative Consent Order with NJ DEP, PVWC was seeking to replace its three open finished water reservoirs (Levine, New Street and Great Notch) with enclosed water storage tanks.

Based on a number of engineering studies, PVWC had decided enclosed water storage tanks would be the most cost-efficient and secure method to store finished drinking water. The studies considered alternatives, such as covering the reservoirs but concluded that pre-stressed concrete tanks should be constructed on-site at the Levine and New Street reservoirs.

Our initial review found a chaotic situation dominated by public uproar against the project. In addition to numerous negative newspaper articles, there were opposition Facebook pages with more than 1,200 followers and a petition on Change.org demanding that the project be stopped had received more than 1,000 supporters.

In addition, the project had been publicly denounced by more than two dozen nearby communities, the NJ Senate, members of the state's congressional delegation, the Passaic Valley Board of Realtors and others. Further, news articles from the Bergen Record to the Wall Street Journal were openly critical of the project. Mayor Keith Kazmark of Woodland Park had taken a particularly active role in creating opposition about the project.

However, most of the objections were filled with misinformation, half-truths and untruths. Moreover, a series of meetings designed to educate the public had actually provided a platform to fuel opposition and allow for the spreading of further misinformation about the project.

When JGSC Group came on board, a strategy was developed to educate the public about the project while pushing back against those that were stoking fears and spreading misinformation about the project. This strategy included a focused effort on overcoming media bias in news reports.

Over the past 43 months, JGSC Group along with PVWC have been able to educate the public, gauge support for the project and quell much of the unfounded opposition to the project. The media reports are now more factual and less biased. However, a small group of opponents including David Soo, Bob Guarasci and Leonard Zax (Hamilton Partnership) continue to lobby against the project and spread misinformation about the need, impact and solutions.

The Levine Reservoir project is awaiting final approval of the EPA of the Section 106 review. This effort was delayed by last-minute lobbying. Approval is still needed from both Passaic County and the Paterson Historic Council. Gianfranco Archimedes, the Executive Director of the Paterson Preservation Commission has already stated that the Commission is likely to deny PVWC's permits.

Experience

JGSC Group has extensive experience with community outreach, in general, and the PVWC Water Storage Improvement project in particular. Perhaps the most effective way to demonstrate our level of experience is to how our experience meets and exceeds each of the tasks outlined in "scope of services" in Appendix D of the Request for Proposals document.

The following highlights our specific experience with each of these tasks:

Compliance with NJDEP's Administrative Consent Order – JGSC Group is fully familiar with the Administrative Consent Orders and has played an active role in ensuring compliance. For example, JGSC helped to develop the outreach plan that was presented to, and approved by NJDEP In August 2015. JGSC has further participated in compliance efforts including presenting the findings of the 2016 consumer survey, participating in and presenting during the 2018 hearing before NJ SHPO, and presenting and participating in the 2019 Section 106 review meeting with stakeholders.

Development of Action Plans – JGSC Group has developed a preliminary action plan for the outreach effort for the coming months. We developed and implemented the original action plan and have been responsible for revising and implement additional plans as the situation has changed. We believe the plans developed and implemented by JGSC Group have been largely responsible for educating the public, calming the media frenzy, reducing the level of public opposition, and helping to advance the project through the approval process.

Outreach to community groups to create a grass roots movement – JGSC Group has conducted outreach to a number of community groups with the goal of creating grass roots support for the project and growing awareness about the risks of lead in drinking water. Among others, we have conducted outreach and coordinated with the following organizations:

- Partnership for Maternal & Child Health Lead Poisoning Prevention Program
- The Paterson Alliance
- NJ Community Development Corporation
- 4CS of Passaic County

Action Plan

Based on our experience with the Levine and New Street Reservoir projects and similar situations, we recommend the following plan. (PLEASE NOTE: The concepts described within this document are deliberately vague because this proposal is likely to become a publicly available document.)

Action Plan related to the Water Storage Improvement project – This project is being stalled because of lobbying efforts from the Hamilton Partnership and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP). Assuming this situation can be resolved, the project will then need approval from the Paterson Historic Council (PHC), among others. PHC's Executive Director has already made comments indicating that it is likely PVWC's permit application will be denied.

Meanwhile, lead testing results continue to prove that Paterson residents are being exposed to unnecessary lead levels in the drinking water. To overcome these obstacles, JGSC Group recommends the following actions:

- Meet with local public officials to educate them about the situation and the risks of lead in the drinking water of their constituents as well as those in Paterson.
- Work with targeted news media to publicize the situation and alert area consumers that public health and safety is at risk because of the actions of the lobbyists.
- Conduct outreach to community groups and organizations, especially those with a special
 interest in the topics of health, public safety, and water quality to create grass roots support for
 completing the projects.
- Produce and distribute educational brochures and bill stuffers to consumers and customers to raise their awareness about the risks associated with open finished water reservoirs.
- Conduct media outreach including press releases, media alerts and press conferences to inform the public of the environmental injustice of delaying the project.
- Create and launch a digital ad campaign to call attention to the situation, identify those that are obstructing progress and calling upon grass root organizations to contact their public officials to call for immediate action.

Action Plan related to the replacement of customer-owned lead service lines – PVWC believes there are at least 14,000 homes that still have customer-owned lead service lines (LSL) in use. Of that total, about one-half of those LSLs are in the City of Paterson. This is particularly dangerous because consumers in Paterson are the primary recipients of drinking water that has not been treated with phosphate-based corrosion inhibitors, meaning these residents are more susceptible to the risks of lead in the drinking water. To encourage participation in changing -out the remaining LSLs, JGSC Group proposes the following Action Plan:

Conduct proactive outreach with local public officials (including both elected and health officials
to educate them about the risks, inform them of PVWC's plan of action, and solicit their support
of PVWC's efforts;

- Assuming PVWC knows the addresses of properties with LSLs, we would produce and
 distribute a series of direct mail pieces that informs the recipient of the risks of lead in their
 drinking water, explains their options for replacing their LSL and encourages them to take
 immediate action;
- Work with the PVWC Outreach Team and local community organizations to create a grass root movement that helps build awareness of the issue and encourages residents to take action to remove LSLs from their property;
- Coordinate with the PVWC Outreach Team, local communities, and grass roots organizations to conduct door-to-door canvassing and public events to raise awareness about the issue of LSLs and to encourage targeted properties to participate;
- Create and launch a digital ad campaign to call attention to the situation and encourage consumers to have their LSLs replaced; and,
- Work with PVWC to promote legislation that will allow communities to authorize PVWC to take steps to replace LSLs on properties that have been unresponsive prior notices.

Action Plan related to the PVWC Outreach Team – The PVWC Outreach team can become a valuable resource for PVWC. To be effective the team, which was initially assembled in the last quarter of 2019, needs further direction and training. To assist with the development of this team, JGSC Group proposes the following actions (as a minimum):

- Work with PVWC to more clearly define the goals of the team and the scope of services it will
 provide, such as providing ongoing community health fairs, coordinating with local communitybased organizations, and interacting with grass-roots movements as they develop;
- Provide training and guidance in key areas such as media relations, project planning, public education and awareness, and similar topics;
- Assist the Outreach Team with creating awareness about activities and events the team is conducting by providing guidance with project planning, community and media outreach and similar activities; and,
- Coordinate with the Outreach Team about activities, undertaken by JGSC Group, that need coordination with internal departments or other PVWC vendors. Examples of this would include launching digital ad campaigns, direct mail efforts, outreach to community organizations, etc.

As requested in Appendix D, Section E of the Request for Proposals: JGSC Group does not anticipate any out-of-pocket expenses related to this proposal.

Further, while JGSC Group is completely capable of providing the services outlined in Appendix D, Section D1 through D9, we do not believe it is possible to predict, with any degree of accuracy, how many hours of effort will be required to accomplish each of the tasks outlined in this section. Our experience of the past 43 months demonstrates that our efforts are widely influenced by external pressures that require us to be responsive and reactive, rather than simply charting a course forward.

Frankly, we are somewhat confused by the descriptions listed in Appendix D, Sections D1 through D9. For example, Section D3 and D5 both describe meetings and communications with the media related to the water storage improvement project. Moreover, Section D7 appears to be a continuation of Section D6. Still, in an effort to be compliant with the request for proposals, we have estimated the "proposed hours and corresponding dollars" in the table below. For the table, we have assumed a total of 1,054 hours of efforts by senior staff, junior staff, management and administration.

As further requested in Appendix D, Section E of the Request for Proposals: We understand the intention of assuming "a total of 1,200 hours of effort expended by the Consultant...," however, we believe this may provide an inflated projected cost of the project. We examined our billing records for this specific project for the years 2018 and 2019. Our analysis found that JGSC Group expended 971 hours of effort in calendar 2019, and just 715 hours in 2018. As shown above, we anticipate our efforts should require no more than 1,054 hours, or nearly 20% less than estimated 1,200 hours within the Request for Proposals.

Finally, as specified in Appendix F, Section II, Subsection B, we believe it is not possible to project, with any accuracy, the actual amount of efforts that will be required to complete the scope of work as specified within the Request for Proposals. Because of that, we have elected to include our projected rates and charges as outlined in this section. The table below shows the results of that analysis:

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter "AGREEMENT") made as of ______, 20__ between PASSAIC VALLEY WATER COMMISSION ("PVWC"), a Public Utility Company organized pursuant to its enabling statute (N.J.S.A. 40:62-108 et seq.), having its principal place of business at 1525 Main Avenue, Clifton, New Jersey 07011 and JGSC Group, LLC a professional firm (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL" and/or "contractor") having a place of business at P.O. Box 1148 Merchantville, New Jersey 08109.

WHEREAS, PVWC desires professional services as applicable, to assist PVWC in its ongoing efforts related to Project No. 20-P-60 entitled "Professional Services for Public Outreach and Participation for the Water Storage Improvement Projects" (hereinafter the "PROJECT"); and

WHEREAS, PVWC requires Professional Services to assist it in implementing the PROJECT; and:

WHEREAS, PROFESSIONAL represents that it has the experience and the required professional knowledge to provide the professional services, and/or extraordinary unspecifiable services, as applicable (hereinafter "PROFESSIONAL SERVICES"), and as required by PVWC in this regard as set forth in the "Public Notice", "Table of Contents", and the "Request for Proposals" of the "Request for Proposals for Professional Services (or Extraordinary Unspecifiable Services)", and Appendices A, B, C, & F of the Solicitation (and including, where applicable, Appendix D with additional technical and other requirements attached thereto); all of which, along with a copy of the PROFESSIONAL'S proposal dated February 6, 2020 (as modified February 11, 2020 and referred to herein as the "Modified Proposal"), are collectively referred to herein as the "PROPOSAL" are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the AGREEMENT shall be for the period of time as set forth in Appendix D where applicable, or where not otherwise set forth in Appendix D, the Agreement shall be for up to a one year period of time commencing on the Effective Date of this AGREEMENT as defined in Paragraph 19 herein, and for any extended periods authorized by PVWC.

WHEREAS, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL are desirous of entering into a consulting agreement to cover the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL agree that the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT are the following: $\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{2} \frac{1}$

- 1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES authorized by PVWC and required for the PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL'S obligations under this AGREEMENT are solely for the benefit of PVWC and no other party is intended to benefit or have rights hereunder.
- PROFESSIONAL shall perform the PROFESSIONAL SERVICES as defined under this AGREEMENT at a level customary for competent and prudent professional service providers, all as applicable, performing such services at the time and place where the services are provided ("STANDARD OF CARE"). These services will be provided by professional service providers in the appropriate disciplines, and by other professionals and individuals skilled in other technical disciplines, as appropriate. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion and the coordination of all aspects of its services including reports and other deliverables and services provided under this AGREEMENT. The services to be performed by PROFESSIONAL shall conform to the generally accepted codes and regulations applicable to the subject PROJECT. PROFESSIONAL agrees to indemnify and hold PVWC harmless from all losses and damages resulting from PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE. Further, PROFESSIONAL shall correct and re-perform any services not conforming to the required STANDARD OF CARE without additional compensation and cost to PVWC, (including, but not limited to pending written or oral testimony, reports, etc., which might occur from activities resulting from the performance of this AGREEMENT which were caused by PROFESSIONAL'S performance). In addition, PROFESSIONAL

shall indemnify and hold harmless PVWC and its officers, agents and employees of PVWC from and against any losses, claims, damages, or liabilities to which PVWC may become subject insofar as and to the extent they arise out of the deviation from the STANDARD OF CARE in the performance of the services by the PROFESSIONAL, bereunder.

- 3. The cost of services for the PROJECT shall be invoiced by the PROFESSIONAL on a Time-and-Materials basis, not-to-exceed the negotiated and reduced amount of \$139,912.00 (which reduced amount is based on a negotiated reduction in the not-to-exceed hours stipulated by PVWC in the Request for Proposals ("RFP") for the scope of work set forth therein, and without compromising PVWC's goals and objectives established for the Project for the said scope of work and related tasks set forth in the RFP) and with the quantity set aside for anticipated services related to the PROJECT reduced to 834 total hours. PROFESSIONAL shall invoice PVWC its services hereunder after completion thereof and on the basis of reports and accompanying documents, if appropriate, on a monthly basis, Including therein information as to progress in performance as against one hundred percent (100%) completion thereof and also showing amounts previously compensated hereunder, as against the total authorization. When the billing amount for actual work performed and costs incurred during the period covered by the invoice is less than \$1,000 the PROFESSIONAL shall add the service and costs to the next billing cycle. To the extent Items appearing on invoices presented by PROFESSIONAL are not contested, PVWC will remit payment of the invoice as soon as it can reasonably process same in the normal course of business and barring any failure of systems related thereto or unusual staffing shortages. If at any time it appears to PROFESSIONAL that the proposed scope of services to be performed on the different aspects of any PROJECT will exceed that which was authorized by PVWC, PROFESSIONAL shall clearly indicate same in its continuing written reports. The PROJECT shall be invoiced separately. Each invoice shall include a breakdown of hours expended along with the names of individual expending said hours, along with a breakdown of charges from subcontractors where applicable and out-of-pocket expenses chargeable to the PROJECT. Each invoice shall include a summary sheet including total amount billed for the time period covered by the invoice and the time period covered, total amount billed to date, total not-to-exceed dollar amount for cost of services (said amounts as set forth or defined in Paragraph 3 herein), and balance remaining.
- 4. PROFESSIONAL shall be responsible to PVWC for any subcontractors and outside associates or professional it engages to assist it in the performance of the services required under this AGREEMENT.
- 5. PVWC will provide to PROFESSIONAL all available information, including previous reports and any other data in its possession relevant to the subject PROJECT. Further, PVWC will be responsible for providing PROFESSIONAL access to all public and private property in connection with services to be performed for the PROJECT.
- 6. Both PVWC and PROFESSIONAL understand that the goal of this AGREEMENT is to complete all phases of the subject PROJECT in a reasonably expeditious fashion. To this end each pledges to the other full cooperation.
- 7. The services to be performed under this AGREEMENT for the PROJECT shall be deemed to be completed when the scope of work authorized by PVWC for the PROJECT has satisfactorily been fulfilled.
- 8. By notice in writing at any time, PVWC may change the general scope of services required by PROFESSIONAL as set forth herein. In such event an equitable adjustment, if appropriate, in compensation shall be agreed to in writing prior to PROFESSIONAL'S performing the changed services.
- 9. PROFESSIONAL shall hold secret and confidential all information designated by PVWC as confidential. PROFESSIONAL shall not reveal any designated confidential information to a third party unless the disclosing party was lawfully possessed with the information before receipt of same from the party claiming confidentiality and whose information has been designated as described herein as being confidential, or applicable law, regulation, court order or any agency of competent jurisdiction requires its disclosure; or the failure to disclose the information would pose an imminent and substantial threat to human health or the environment.
- 10. PROFESSIONAL shall maintain insurance against the following risk during the term of this AGREEMENT:

- a) Worker's Compensation in statutory amounts and Employer's Liability for PROFESSIONAL'S employees' for the PROJECT for related injuries or disease; and
- b) General Liability and Automobile Liability (each including excess coverage as required) and each in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for personal injury or property damage to third parties which arises from PROFESSIONAL'S performance under this AGREEMENT; and
- c) Professional Llability in the amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for legal obligations arising out of PROFESSIONAL'S failure to meet the STANDARD OF CARE or other items covered under such Professional Liability policy.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide to the PVWC certificates of insurance as to each of the above which evidence that the policies are in effect.

- 11. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey and any litigation/arbitration relating to the AGREEMENT shall be venued in New Jersey. In the event of litigation, the parties agree and consent to the action being initiated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Passaic County.
- 12. PROFESSIONAL represents that it is an Independent professional and not an employee of PVWC.
- 13. If a dispute or complaint arises concerning this AGREEMENT, PVWC and PROFESSIONAL will negotiate a resolution of the dispute. Should negotiations be unsuccessful, the resolution of the dispute shall be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the current Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association and the arbitration proceeding shall be venued in New Jersey. Any decision rendered by the arbitrators shall be final. Judgment may be entered upon the decision in any court having jurisdiction. The decision shall not be subject to modification or appeal except to the extent permitted by Sections 10 and 11 of the Federal Arbitration Act (9 U.S.C. 10, 11). Notwithstanding the aforementioned, disputes which have a total value (exclusive of interest) in excess of the dollar amount for cost of services (said dollar amount as stipulated in paragraph 3 herein) shall not be arbitrated but shall be litigated.
- 14. All notices required or intended under this AGREEMENT may be delivered in person, by facsimile or express mall. All notices shall be effective upon the date of receipt by the parties. Notices shall be delivered or sent to the other party at the address appearing in this AGREEMENT. An address may only be changed by written notice to the other party.
- 15. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- a) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Except with respect to affectional or sexual orientation and gender identity or expression, the contractor will ensure that equal employment opportunity is afforded to such applicants in recruitment and employment, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex. Such equal employment opportunity shall include but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.
- c) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative or workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the

agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

- d) The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- e) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to afford equal employment opportunities to minority and women workers consistent with good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2, or Good faith efforts to meet targeted county employment goals determined by the Division, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.
- f) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.
- g) The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personal testing conforms to the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- h) In conforming with the applicable employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.
- i) The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:
 - -Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval
 - -Certificate of Employee Information Report
 - -Employee Information Report Form AA302
- j) The contractor and its subcontractor shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 16. This AGREEMENT is subject to termination at the conclusion of all of the Contract work, time being of the essence as described herein, unless extended by the mutual agreement of the Parties. PVWC retains the right to terminate the PROFESSIONAL upon 15 days' notice to the PROFESSIONAL, which notice shall be effective when given to the PROFESSIONAL in writing at the PROFESSIONAL'S place of business by way of certified mail return receipt requested and regular mail. No other Notice shall be necessary. Should termination under this Article take place, the PROFESSIONAL shall be entitled to compensation for all authorized Contract work completed satisfactorily to the date of termination. PVWC shall be the sole judge of satisfactory work.
- 17. This AGREEMENT, including any schedules, attachments and referenced documents, is the entire agreement between PVWC and PROFESSIONAL. Any prior or contemporaneous agreements, promises, negotiations or representations not expressly stated herein are of no force and effect. Any changes to this AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PVWC and PROFESSIONAL.
- 18. A waiver or breach of any term, condition or covenant by a party shall not constitute a waiver or breach of any other term, condition or covenant. If any court of competent jurisdiction declares a provision of the AGREEMENT invalid, illegal

or otherwise unenforceable, the remaining provisions of the AGREEMENT shall remain in full force and effect.

- 19. The effective date of this AGREEMENT shall be as of the date set forth hereinabove, or where such date is not indicated, the effective date of the AGREEMENT shall be when the last of the two parties is in full possession of a fully executed AGREEMENT document.
- 20. PROFESSIONAL'S hourly rates for technical and related support services and non-labor expenses shall be as set forth in the PROPOSAL.
- 21. PROFESSIONAL understands and agrees that upon submission to PVWC and upon receipt of proper payment as provided for in this AGREEMENT, any reports, data, logs or other information provided to PVWC pursuant to the terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT (and which are not designated in accordance with Paragraph 9 of this AGREEMENT as being confidential) are deemed to be non-proprietary to the extent that PVWC, in its sole discretion, may utilize the information submitted for whatever purposes it deems necessary or desirable without seeking permission from PROFESSIONAL, and without providing any additional compensation to PROFESSIONAL; provided, however, that PVWC shall have sole responsibility for use of such work products in applications for which they may not originally have been intended. Reports, data, logs and other information provided to PVWC by PROFESSIONAL shall become the property of PVWC provided, however, that PROFESSIONAL shall have unrestricted right to their use.
- 22. PVWC designates the Executive Director, the Director of Engineering, or the General Counsel, of the PVWC as its designated representative having authority to give instructions, receive information, define PVWC'S policies, and make decisions with respect to the scope of the work to be performed. PVWC reserves the right to change these designees from time to time and will notify PROFESSIONAL of any change(s) in writing.
- 23. Except as otherwise approved by PVWC, for the PROJECT, PVWC will be responsible for furnishing all approvals and permits from governmental authorities and other entities having jurisdiction over the scope of the work to be performed and approvals from others as may be necessary for the timely completion of the sald work, including payment of all permit fees.
- 24. This AGREEMENT may be executed in several counterparts and all so executed documents shall constitute one agreement, binding on all the parties hereto, notwithstanding that all the parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.

The Financial Aid package that the PVWC relies upon to pay for the construction of the Standby Emergency Generators Project (Contract No. 15-B-25) ("Project") contains a term limit of three (3) years, which is set to expire on June 25, 2020. See Subrecipient Agreement, Part VII.A.2 at 14 ("this Agreement shall remain in effect for three (3) years from the Effective Date."). The "Effective Date" was June 25, 2017, therefore the Subrecipient Agreement is set to expire in about four months. Because the Project is not expected to be completed until sometime in the year 2021, the PVWC needs to apply to the NJ DEP for an extension.

Paul T. Hauch, P.E., Section Chief of the NJ DEP, recommended that the PVWC apply for an extension of the Subrecipient Agreement in accordance with Part XII.U, which states as follows:

U. Notices

Any notice required or permitted to be given under or in connection with this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be (i) hand-delivered; (ii) mailed, postage prepaid by first- class mail or registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; (iii) delivered by private commercial carrier, such as Federal Express or United Parcel Service; or (iv) sent by email. All such communications shall be transmitted to the address set forth below, or such other address as may be hereafter designated by a Party in written notice to the other Party compliant with this Section.

Subrecipient Agreement, Part XII.U at 22-23. Although Mr. Hauch did not comment on the PVWC's chances of obtaining the extension, I took his recommendation as a positive sign that the PVWC has, at a minimum, good cause for making the request.

Therefore, I recommend that the PVWC apply to the NJ DEP for an extension of the Subrecipient Agreement so as not to disrupt the PVWC's ability to fund and complete the Standby Emergency Generators Project.

It would appear that the maximum extension that the PVWC can request at this time is until June 30, 2022. Mr. Hauch advised us that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has given the DEP a deadline of June 30, 2022 to expend all of its available CDGB-DR funds. It is not clear whether this deadline is firm and cannot be extended, as we did not discuss that possibility. In any event, it would appear that an extension to June 30, 2022, should be sufficient to complete the Project, and we do not anticipate needing any further extensions.
