1	COMMISSIONER KOLOZIEJ: We have a quorum.
2	MR. AMODIO: On the roll.
3	Commissioners Levine and Vannoy are not
4	yet here. Commissioner Sanchez will not be with
5	us.
6	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
7	present respond in the affirmative. Commissioner
8	Levine is not present yet. Commissioner Vannoy
9	and President Sanchez are absent)
10	
11	MR. AMODIO: The time is 12:02 p.m.
12	You have a quorum.
13	All of the requirements of the Open Public
14	Meetings Act have been met. Notices have been
15	furnished to all Commissioners; City Clerks of
16	Paterson, Passaic, and Clifton; North Jersey
17	Herald News; The Record - Passaic County edition
18	and the Commission's Executive Staff with a copy
19	posted at the main bulletin board at the Clifton
20	facility.
21	MR. AMODIO: Would you please rise.
22	Commissioner Friend
23	
24	(Pledge of Allegiance)

1	(Whereupon, Commissioner Levine is present
2	at 12:04)
3	
4	MR. AMODIO: We have two members of the
5	public.
6	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Okay. Mr.
7	Linteris, as always, first up.
8	MR. LINTERIS: Thank you.
9	Bill Linteris, representing Passaic County
10	Board of Realtors. I'd like to address the
11	Commission and thank you for the public outreach
12	that you're providing for the New Street Reservoir
13	and hope that it continues in the future. I know
14	we have another meeting coming up in September.
15	Mark LoBauer, I guess, came and discussed with us,
16	looked for our feedback and information regarding
17	the outreach and what could be done. We thank you
18	for that and look forward to moving forward.
19	It's also understood that not everybody
20	understands how the reservoirs are used and by
21	being here at least I have the knowledge so I was
22	able to share it with others so that they know
23	that it's not just emergency reservoir and that it
24	issues on regular basis to work with the demand
25	that you have in your system.

1	So, again, thank you for the outreach and
2	look forward to having it move forward.
3	Also, thank you for looking at the Great
4	Notch and working with the Newark Water Supply as
5	to an alternative there to be able to preserve or
6	not tank that particular reservoir.
7	Thank you.
8	MR. WALTERS: Good afternoon. John
9	Walters, Passaic County Board of Realtors
10	President.
11	I also just have to echo what Bill said.
12	It was a great meeting because it was not
13	adversarial. It was really just to get
14	information and we did find out that some people
15	had the misunderstanding, like Bill said, of
16	exactly how the water system works. So, again,
17	thank you very much and we appreciate what you're
18	doing.
19	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I don't see any
20	other members of the public so a motion to close
21	the public hearing.
22	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: So move.
23	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: Second.
24	MR. AMODIO: Motion by Commissioner
25	Levine

1	Second by Commissioner Cleaves.
2	On the roll.
3	
4	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
5	present respond in the affirmative. Commissioner
6	Vannoy and President Sanchez are absent)
7	
8	MR. AMODIO: Time is 12:05 p.m.
9	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I want to go
10	right back to the Realtors Association. We
11	appreciate your faithfulness in disseminating
12	information. How people deal with it is up to
13	them but the fact that you have so many meetings
14	under your belt that you probably know as much
15	about how we distribute our water as each of these
16	Commissioners do. So thank you for your
17	faithfulness and that leads me to believe that we
18	will have an outcome that will maybe not be to
19	everybody's liking, but at least be a compromise
20	that everybody can live with. So I'm hoping that
21	it works in that direction.
22	All right. Committee reports.
23	Personnel. I only see Commissioner Friend
24	here so
25	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: We really haven't

1 had a meeting since the last.

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COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Right. I'm going to wait until Mr. Bella's report because I notice in his report he does include a section on personnel, so we'll address that when we get to his report.

Jerry, we're so glad you've been busy. Do you ever go home?

meeting on Monday with our auditors and Mr. Bella was present and Mr. Hanley was present and the entire finance committee was there. We reviewed the preliminary audit for the year 2015 and there was some recommendations made, some additional information that has to be obtained and they hope to have the final report ready to present to the full Board either in October or November. And that was basically what took place at the finance committee meeting.

COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: We appreciate the hard work and finance has really, since it's been shared before by Commissioner Levine, each chairperson has really kept the momentum going and when you run a business like ours and the bottom line is best rate for our ratepayers, your work

1	has certainly been appreciated by all of us.
2	Okay. Executive Director's report.
3	MR. BELLA: Okay. The main issue I want
4	to bring, not the main, but one of the issues is
5	the conditions, the weather conditions.
6	Basically, the climate conditions are such that it
7	has been very dry. Stream flows are becoming very
8	low and we've been meeting and talking to the
9	State about this and preparing. People are doing
10	remodeling. But it will be difficult to predict
11	what will happen but we're preparing in
12	conjunction with the State DEP ways to start
13	moving water around and it's never easy for anyone
14	to do that. Sometimes it's, you know, we'll have
15	some costs associated with it. As we get closer
16	I'll keep you up to speed what we'll be ordered to
17	do or asked to do depending on what the State and
18	what point of their process they have to go
19	through. They may start asking us to move water
20	into different systems and at cost of, you know,
21	whatever that is. But I'll keep you up to speed
22	on that.
23	We've had a dry spree, but it's going into
24	winter and that's usually a wet season. In New
25	Jersey it almost always rains at some point during

the wintertime enough that we have enough water to get through the next year. If you look at the history, since 1980 we've actually had more rain per year, about three inches. But the way it falls nowadays where it's falling at very distinct and in shorter period of time. My recollection as a kid you get four or five days where it just kind of teemed rained. Well, this is making the whole landscape of how we think about drought and that kind of thing change. So we'll keep you up to speed as this progresses. In fact, we have another meeting scheduled I think like the 1st of October, right around the 1st of October. But that's getting serious.

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On the good side of that is revenues, you know, is more irrigation use has been stronger. Our wholesale customers, particularly the suburban customers, are using more water for landscaping, that kind of thing so that has helped us. The water quality, despite being very low, has been excellent in terms of treatability and that kind of thing. And you can see our treatment costs have actually dropped down a little bit. So that's working well.

On the engineering front, we're preparing

1	a large amount of we have a lot of
2	specifications going out for some piping work.
3	We're going to be doing a lot of piping work over
4	the next nine months. This will be going out in
5	the next, early winter, midwinter and the work
6	will be done next summer. We pretty much have
7	that money earmarked for those projects and that's
8	working very well.

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really appreciate because every time I read that back portion which is very technical but I force myself to do that and I was amazed that we are in compliance with all the testing that we needed to do with the kind of weather conditions we've had. So whoever gets kudos for that, they well deserve it because it must be extremely difficult in almost drought conditions to maintain, you know, not exceeding those levels that we're testing for. So good job, everybody.

Finance I'm sure you're tracking. It always bothers me because we have to really pick a number out of the hat for our anticipation for revenue. So I'm sure that's one of the things you're tracking on finance that we're not under that, but we're saving money in other ways so that

even if we are, we're offsetting that cost.

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But if you'll just indulge me for those of you that have your report with you, page 9 of the Director's report obviously is going to be a new section and that's fine with me because it's entitled: Personnel. And I'm sure I'm well within my boundaries as long as I don't specifically mention any employee, to just keep a general discussion because the recommendation here is that we've been talking several months now about getting a T.O. that's up to date and whatever position is we're going to be asked in October if it's so recommended by the personnel committee to vote on some promotions, title changes.

For those of you that are familiar with Civil Service. We are a Civil Service entity. So my questions basically are: Are we going to see, Mr. Bella, a current T.O.? They're going to need it, the committee's going to need it just to deal with this, so we will have that. And, obviously, you know, I'm only speaking for myself, but if we have budgeted for a position and it's a promotion and that's a position, I'm okay with that. If it's, not then I'm thinking that's something that

1	finance is going to have to look at and possibly
2	budget for next year as we set our budget.
3	And my other question is since these are
4	mostly promotional, will a Civil Service test be
5	called or is this something that we can just?
6	MR. BELLA: Well, it depends on how the
7	progression is. If they're in line promotions,
8	then it will be a promotional internal, open to
9	internal people and subject to being in the
10	contract.
11	If it's out of line, so to speak, then
12	they'll generate open competitive testing.
13	We'll see how that goes but we'll be
14	working on that with personnel.
15	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Okay. And,
16	again, personnel is doing a super job. And this
17	late in the year it's kind of tough. I think if
18	you as a committee can set these things in place,
19	it will serve us well for 2017.
20	MR. BELLA: I'm going to try to carry this
21	kind of thing here so that we have this future
22	look that we're going to be bringing to the
23	meeting.
24	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: It helps those of
25	us who don't sit on that committee, it helps us at

least to start thinking in terms of you heard my questions but I'm sure the committee's going to have enough of their own also.

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But there's no excuse anymore for not having a current T.O. with every single position that's filled because, you know, it leaves finance with some options as to maybe eliminating those that haven't been filled and maybe needing to create new ones that need to bring this organization up to the administrative level that we do.

And, also, I think it would be helpful if the personnel committee had a handle on just how many retirements we may be having. Commissioner Friend will note when we struggle with that as council people, you like to know ahead of time that there's going to be possible retirements because if you don't have a succession, you're kind of left here: I'm retiring, I'm gone.

So, Joe, if you can make sure that the committee knows, again, it may not happen, it may, but at least to know what level of employees may be retiring so we can start thinking of what we need to do.

MR. BELLA: It's certainly going to be a

1	challenge in the next five years.
2	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Yeah, yeah.
3	MR. BELLA: That's why part of these
4	promotions, not part, many of these promotions are
5	important. We have people in lower positions that
6	we need to start moving into, you know, leadership
7	positions so that, you know, we're prepared for
8	that.
9	It's really important in the sense that a
LO	lot of the people that they're talking about,
11	they're here in a labor position for three, five
L2	years, seven years. It's now time to start
L3	putting them in that progression of in-line
L 4	promotions so that way when all this happens,
L5	everything will be there and the Commission won't
L 6	suffer or the consumers won't suffer.
L7	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: So maybe I should
L8	be grateful I'm not serving on personnel.
L 9	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: When you're done, I
20	have a question.
21	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Go ahead.
22	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: I have two things.
23	I discussed this with Mr. Bella briefly.
24	I see that National Park Service has
25	requested that we convey certain lines within the

Great Falls Historical Park. I see there's
agreements that they presented and our Law
Department is working on agreements but I would
like to hear from our Administration, not today,
but to give us a report when we're given these
agreements in terms of what the pluses and minuses
are of this taking place aside from the legal
agreements, but what the pluses are for the
Passaic Valley Water Commission.

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MR. BELLA: The next meeting we'll have a little presentation ready for you so you can see on a map or aerial pictures what exactly.

COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Okay. My second point is, and I had raised this at the finance committee the other day, we have a substantial amount is outstanding that money owed to the Passaic Valley Water Commission that I indicated needs to be perhaps a little bit more aggressively attacked. I don't know, do we have somebody in charge of what the collection process is when the people get 60, 90, 120 days behind and owe a substantial sum. And I had indicated at the finance committee Monday that in the event we needed additional employees, whether full time or part time in order to review these collections,

1	because as Mrs. Kolodziej said when we have to
2	anticipate revenue for the following year in our
3	budget, are we bound by the amount of collections
4	from the prior year in terms of what we can budget
5	for in terms of revenue?
6	MR. WEISS: No.
7	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: No. Okay.
8	MR. WEISS: We're not like a municipality.
9	In terms of taxes you're talking about, no, we're
10	not restricted by that.
11	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Okay. I still
12	think, you know, that some of these customers are
13	individuals, some of these customers are apartment
14	complex, some of these customers are entities, you
15	know, not municipal entities, but anyway, I just
16	think that we should not let it get this far
17	behind as it is, so maybe we can get a report or
18	recommendation from that.
19	And then it's not in Joe's report, but
20	since one of the speakers spoke about it, maybe I
21	can. I received this in the mail yesterday from a
22	resident of the City of Clifton, okay, how many
23	people that showed up at the last hearing that
24	MR. LINTERIS: Thirty-four in one room and
25	then the other room had 20, 22.

1	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Do we know what
2	towns were represented by those 34?
3	MR. BELLA: Well, mainly, Woodland Park.
4	This is the issue of New Street, so that's mainly
5	residents from Woodland Park.
6	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Okay. But the thing
7	is, I as a resident of the City of Clifton,
8	received this and if I wanted to attend, it
9	doesn't have the address of the Woodland Park
10	Municipal Building, okay, which I think would be
11	an important factor because I don't think most
12	residents of Clifton or maybe even Passaic and
13	Paterson know where the Woodland Park Municipal
14	Building is.
15	But secondly, even though it affects
16	Woodland Park, mainly, is there any reason why
17	we're not scheduling meetings within the three
18	owner towns.
19	MR. BELLA: Because we have already done a
20	lot of those kind of meetings.
21	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Right.
22	MR. BELLA: That's the reason why we
23	didn't go back to scheduling here. We've done the
24	survey in the owner cities. We sent that out to
25	135,000 of our own residents and then we tend to

1	start scheduling, you know, with some scheduling
2	meetings with just informative meetings in terms
3	of, you know, with some of the on the political
4	side of this.
5	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: Okay. I just think,
6	I don't know how many more meetings there's going
7	to be in the future, but perhaps if they're going
8	to go out to the residents of Clifton, Passaic,
9	and Paterson that we ought to consider, you know,
10	holding. This is the second meeting within a
11	couple week period in Woodland Park, maybe we
12	should schedule something within the owner towns
13	as well.
14	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: I'm not really
15	sure what the attendance would be, but the more
16	opportunity you give the public to respond and my
17	children keep pointing out to me: Mommy, you can
18	do everything online now, why do you need a
19	meeting because you can just do everything online.
20	But, you know, the ability to sit there and have a
21	person answer you instead of, you know.
22	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: It doesn't indicate
23	that it's limited to residents of Woodland Park.
24	It was a general to all of the water customers.

COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: It doesn't.

And if each Commissioner would go back to their appointing authority, if any council feels that they need a special presentation, we can do that also.

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But one of the very first presentations that we scheduled was with the mayors of the three owner cities so they had all that information before it even went the next step and given some good input as to how to do that.

MR. BELLA: And this meeting, remember, this meeting here is we're trying to get to the people that are directly impacted from the view shed kind of thing and what suggestions they might have to help mitigate that. Once we get all that information and as we start to move into the design and start to understand what it's really going to look like. Right now we don't have a firm idea what it's going to turn out to look like that's when we would, you know, do some more like that.

COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: That's what struck me odd, this beautiful picture of the New Street Reservoir and I'm thinking to myself:
Okay, where are these tanks going. So I may be at that meeting to refresh my memory.

MR. AMODIO: No other questions?
COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: No other
questions.
MR. AMODIO: We have a two requests for
use of the Point View Reservoir by the Passaic
County Police Academy and we have a request from
North Jersey Elks, it's their annual emergency
drill and they use our garage for that drill. So
those three requests are on there.
Any questions?
COMMISSIONER LEVINE: We have a hold
harmless?
MR. AMODIO: Yes, we do.
COMMISSIONER LEVINE: For the Elks?
MR. AMODIO: Hold harmless and insurance.
COMMISSIONER LEVINE: I know the police
does but I didn't know the Elks does.
MR. AMODIO: If there's no questions, can
I have a motion?
COMMISSIONER FRIEND: I'll move.
COMMISSIONER BLUMENTHAL: Second.
MR. AMODIO: By Commissioner Friend.
Second by Commissioner Blumenthal.
On the roll.

1	(Roll call was taken, all Commissioners
2	present respond in the affirmative. Commissioner
3	Vannoy and President Sanchez are absent)
4	
5	MR. AMODIO: Thank you.
6	Moving on to the Controller's report.
7	MR. WEISS: Cash on hand is just over
8	\$11 million.
9	Our accounts receivable is 16.6 million.
10	Our 30 days or less accounts receivable is
11	15.7 million. That's right around 95 percent
12	which is really what we expected it to be. If
13	you'll remember a couple of months ago I reported
14	to you that our 30 days or less was significantly
15	less than that. I think it was down to
16	85 percent. They actually list, this speaks what
17	Commissioner Friend was speaking about, the
18	Distribution Department and Customer Service
19	really stepped up going after a lot of the
20	stragglers and they were able to bring that back
21	into line, so things are not full exactly where
22	they should be but going in the right direction.
23	Accounts payable's at 3.4 million.
24	As Commissioner Friend mentioned the
25	audit's being finalized. We should have it,

1	hopefully, for next month.
2	And billing and collections are strong.
3	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Any questions?
4	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: I have a question
5	about overtime. Do I ask that now?
6	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Now is perfect.
7	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: Or closed session.
8	On the overtime listing that we received
9	there is a large jump from overtime from 2015 to
10	2016 in a department, in one department. And I
11	guess I would like to have some clarity as to why
12	the big jump in overtime in that department?
13	COMMISSIONER LEVINE: What department is
14	that?
15	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Yes, you can
16	mention the department.
17	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: I can?
18	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Yes.
19	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: It's in the
20	Personnel Department. The overtime jumped from
21	Personnel 2015 from \$6,510 to 2016 to over
22	\$18,799.
23	MR. BELLA: Okay. We'll look into it for
24	you, Commissioner.
25	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Good catch.

1	MR. BELLA: Part of that might be, I think
2	some of the people in Legal are actually under,
3	not, works at any rate, I'll look into the
4	details of that. But I think it's the way some of
5	the people, the clerical people in Legal are under
6	Personnel, actually work out of the Personnel
7	Department.
8	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: All right. So
9	we're going to get a clarification because as
10	Commissioner Cleaves picked it up right away.
11	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: Yeah, now I'm going
12	to go to the Legal Department. 2015 okay.
13	So but I see that the Legal Department's
14	overtime did decrease, but that's still an awful
15	large percentage between 2015 and 2016 in
16	Personnel, so.
17	MR. BELLA: I'll look into it and get the
18	details.
19	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: Yes, thank you.
20	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Since everybody's
21	been making an effort to keep overtime to a
22	minimum, things like this really Thank you for
23	catching that one for us.
24	MR. AMODIO: Anything else?
25	Motion for closed.

1	COMMISSIONER BLUMENTHAL: Move.
2	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: Second.
3	MR. AMODIO: WHEREAS, Commissioner
4	Blumenthal offers the following Resolution for

24	resolutions, I presume the 459 and the 529 are for
25	the two wears not per wear?

1	MR. DUPREY: That's correct.
2	COMMISSIONER FRIEND: That's number one.
3	Is it not-to-exceed, in other words, as needed?
4	MR. DUPREY: Yes. It's a take and pay
5	contract, Commissioner, so a not-to-exceed amount.
6	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: And the question
7	on the proprietary software, it's only for six
8	months. Is this something we're still looking
9	into? We don't seem to have a computer committee
10	anymore, so, you know, I'm just, why it wouldn't
11	be a longer contract.
12	MR. DUPREY: Yeah, I discussed that with
13	the Director of Purchasing and what they're saying
14	is that if one of these modules, as we're
15	converting, we're continuing onto the new system,
16	if one of those drop by the wayside there would be
17	a reduction. But if we continued it for an entire
18	year, we run a risk that we'd be paying for a
19	module that we no longer use.
20	COMMISSIONER KOLODZIEJ: Okay. Makes
21	sense.
22	MR. DUPREY: Just trying to save.
23	COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: I have a question
24	too.
25	For Resolution number one, explain what is

1 that for, for School 16? That's one of our new 2 schools. MR. DUPREY: What we did was they paid for 3 a 12-inch new water line relocation along the 5 Route 80 exit ramp by Madison Avenue and it 6 connected into a system and so they provided that 7 little area for couple of hydrants so what this Resolution is for is to record and memorialize the 8 9 easement so that we'll always have access to that 10 for maintenance and repairs. 11 COMMISSIONER CLEAVES: I have a question. 12 We have another new school, they didn't do the 13 same. So you say this is for additional hydrants 14 in that area? 15 MR. DUPREY: Yes, this particular one, 16 they had to relocate the pipe anyway for this particular design that leads to this location. 17 18 But in the process, they agreed to provide this 19 which helps our system out and the piping gets turned over to us. So in order for us in the 20 21 future to have access and maintain it and make 22 sure they don't build anything over the top of it, 23 that's why we're going for the deed and easement 24 and all that.
